## Carrier Status 214 Notes

## Purpose

The Transportation Carrier Shipment Status Message (EDI=214) is sent from the trading partner to General Mills. See two status's listed in the key elements below - you need a trigger mechanism in your application to send this data.

Note: that this transaction is version 4030 UCS.

## Key elements:

B1002 $=$ Shipment number (PO number if from vendor)
L1 101 = Delivery number (PO number if from vendor)
AT701 = qualifier
AM = Truck is loaded and ready for departure
X1 = Truck has arrived at warehousing location
AT705 = date
AT706 = time

Further Status Definition:
$\mathbf{A M}=$ Truck is loaded and ready for departure
This status is sent only for outbound loads. It tells General Mills that a load is ready to ship and we can send a notice to the tractor to pick up the trailer. Sent before the Notice of Shipment (EDI=945) which is triggered when it leaves the yard.

X1 = Truck has arrived at warehousing location
This status is sent only for inbound loads. It tells General Mills that a truck has arrived (product is in the yard) even though it may be some time before it is off the truck. Sent before the Notice of Receipt (EDI=944) which is triggered when truck is actually unloaded. As of April 2019, functionality for reporting when the load comes from a vendor was also included.
